GIFTED EDUCATION

Last week two of our staff members completed the Mini Certificate of Gifted Education, presented by Dr Peta Hay from the University of NSW. A lecturer in gifted education, Dr Hay works with teachers and schools across Australia, helping them to cater for gifted students.

We have invited Dr Hay back to Perth in Term 3 to work with more of our teaching staff. Our teachers will be supported in the creation of stimulating and engaging programs for our Gifted and Talented Selective Academic Program, as well as for students in our Academic Excellence Academy. This will also impact positively on all students at Fremantle College through a deeper understanding of curriculum differentiation for all learners.

ENGLISH CLASSROOM PRESENTATIONS

The students of South Fremantle SHS have been able to meet Fremantle College's Executive team as they have been visiting all Year 7 to Year 11 English classes. We have been introducing the students to Fremantle College, letting them know about our programs, new buildings and uniforms, as well as our new college values of Perseverance, Leadership, Enthusiasm for Learning, Curiosity and Kindness.

Students have had the opportunity to ask questions of us, with queries ranging from locker use to the canteen menu to Specialist programs. BUILDING UPDATE

Principal Myles Draper and several Fremantle College staff members had the pleasure last week of attending a tour of our new facilities. The main building at the front of the site will house Performing Arts, Mathematics, Science, English, Student Services and the Autism Extension Program. The Visual Arts, which includes our ICT collaborative learning space, Television Studio, Digital Media, Drawing, Painting, Ceramics, Textiles, Marine Science and General Learning Areas, will also be available for use.

The most striking feature of the new buildings is the positive atmosphere and outlook of the classrooms. With a look and feel akin to a modern university, the new learning areas are set up for collaborative learning and can be reconfigured in a matter of minutes from traditional classroom to open learning space. The Science laboratories are truly spectacular with cutting edge equipment and technology to enhance the learning experiences of students.

ENROLMENTS

Enrolments for our first cohort of Year 7 students at Fremantle College have been steadily coming through our administration office, with students keen to begin their secondary schooling in 2018. Selection processes have also been undertaken for our Academic Excellence Academy, and auditions completed for Specialist Contemporary Music.
