Our Programs

Gifted and Talented Secondary Selective Academic Program

Our Gifted and Talented Secondary Selective Academic Program will provide your child with challenging and highly motivating learning opportunities. Our program provides an engaging and stimulating learning environment to children with exceptional academic capacity in the subject areas of English, Humanities and Social Sciences, Math and Science. The teaching staff work with students to foster advanced analytical, critical and creative thinking skills. Students within the program follow a curriculum that is differentiated to best support individual learning needs and accelerate learning by extending their skills with advanced and in-depth study.

Specialist Contemporary Music Program

Our Approved Specialist Contemporary Music Program will provide your child with a dynamic and enriched curriculum that anchors theory in practice in an environment that supports creativity and personal music growth. Through the writing, arranging, recording and performing of their original compositions, your child's creative potential is nurtured and extended. Our students enjoy access to weekly instrumental lessons, class music lessons, bands, ensembles and digial recording facilities. Performance opportunities, camps and tours provide rich cultural and musical experiences.

Specialist Marine Studies Program

Students with a passion for the marine environment, and who are interested in pursuing an academic pathway within this field, will thrive in our highly regarded Approved Specialist Marine Studies Program. With studies in both Marine Science and Marine Practical, students will be immersed in the aquatic world located on the doorstep of Fremantle College. Students will gain a greater understanding of the complex issues that impact our oceans including global climate change, fisheries and food production and maritime pollution, and take steps to support the conversation and management of the marine environment.

Specialist Information, Communication and Technology (ICT) Program

Our Approved Specialist ICT Program offers a specially designed curriculum for the 21st century learner with a focus on Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM). Students build on STEM concepts through solving real world issues that require solutions and exploration. Students also engage in programming and coding. Our students are presented with opportunities to become a developer, conceptualising today for tomorrow's problems. Networking and access to industry professionals support our students' transition from consumer to designer.







Specialised Learning Program for Students with Autism Spectrum Disorder (SLP ASD)

Your child can develop their academic, behavioural, social and emotional needs through our exemplary Specialised Learning Program for Students with Autism Spectrum Disorder (SLP ASD). Students in Years 7 to 12, who have been diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder, are provided with opportunities and support to achieve their academic goals, including ATAR pathways. Personalised Learning Plans are developed that acknowledge and utilise students' individual talents and interests. Your child will learn in the mainstream school setting with additional support through the Specialised Learning Program homeroom and specialist staff. A flexible approach to education in the mainstream setting enables students to work toward self-management of emotions, behaviour and social interactions, leading them to successfully achieve in their secondary schooling and beyond.

AFL Academy

Fremantle College has partnered with the Stephen Michael Foundation and developed a specialised AFL Academy. Our students will develop leadership skills and work together with players and coaches to develop a strong team ethos. Involvement in the AFL Academy also presents links to learning and education through biomechanics, physiology, health and nutrition and further study in Senior School. Students in the AFL Academy represent Fremantle College as a team, and are expected to demonstrate leadership, responsibility and teamwork in all aspects of their schooling and game.

Academic Excellence Academy

The Academic Excellence Academy is a college based program for students in Years 7 to 9 who identify as high academic achievers within the core subject areas. English, HASS, Maths and Science classes provide students with engaging learning programs that accelerate and extend their academic potential. Working from the West Australian Curriculum, students are also invited to step outside of the mainstream content and challenge themselves. Access to state, national and international competitions and programs are incorporated into the Academic Excellence Academy, enabling all students to view and participate in the world outside of their classroom.

Harnessing teacher leadership


Our Excellence in Teaching and Learning Framework

Our Student Services team has a focus on promoting a positive environment at the college, both inside and outside of the classroom. Student Leadership

Fremantle College encourages all students to demonstrate the Value of Leadership, with opportunities at all year levels for students to formally engage as a leader in the Student Leadership Team. The entire student cohort is led by our Year 12 College Captains, who represent the college at various events, and enable to student voice to be effectively heard.





Student Health and Fitness

Fremantle College offers a wide range of varied physical programs for students to partake in. Our college is proud of our high participation rates in our lightning carnival teams, interschool athletics and swimming carnivals. Students are encouraged to participate in sporting activities, providing them with the experience of competing individually or as part of a team.

Our regular health and physical education program form part of our general curriculum for all lower school students, with varied and extensive opportunities to continue studies in upper school.

Learning Support

Learning Support Fremantle College offers a number of additional programs and revision classes for our student groups. Specific curriculum programs for students in both lower school and the senior school provide students with a differentiated classroom to build on their knowledge and skill sets. Targeted interventions for literacy and numeracy are also timetabled to benefit the learning of students. ATAR revisions sessions, homework classes and lunchtime clubs are available to support our students' academic progress.

Breakfast Club

Fremantle College offer daily breakfast every morning, free of charge for all students. This provides our students with the opportunity to volunteer to help, drop in to chat with our Chaplain and other staff members, or develop healthy relationships with their peers in a relaxed and welcoming environment.
