It was wonderful to also welcome Rotary Fremantle on Friday, who attend weekly and help our Breakfast Club students.












Specialist Programs Tour Afternoon Brendon Bleakley, Associate Principal



Robotics Challenge!


During Term 1 our Year 10 Specialist ICT students were tasked to design, build and code a robot that could play 'Rock, Paper, Scissors' against a human opponent.

Time to study the Science of Exams

It is the time of the year when exams are just in front of us.

"So what is the best way to study for exams in Science?"

To be obvious ... to do well in Science exams a student must be able to show their understandings in an exam format. It is not unheard of for truly intelligent students not to do well, simply because they did not perform well in the particular exam format.

So like any high stress event, practice is the key to success. In particular "timed" practice is very useful for students to utilise for achieving their best results.

Teachers from Year 10 to Year 12 have many Semester One Exam Papers (from previous years) on class Connect pages for students to access and download. Students over the next few weeks should complete these exams under similar time constraints as their exam time and mark them.

- · Self marking the paper helps the student clearly see what the depth and detail the exam is expecting.
- Completing the exam under time pressure helps the student prepare for the particular unique aspect of working to this depth and detail under the framework of an exam.

An excellent follow up to this is for the student to bring their completed practice exam papers for their teacher to view. All our science teachers at Fremantle College will be able to give clear and personal advice to achieve successful exam results.

News from Design and Technology by David Bennett, Teacher-In-Charge - Technologies

This term in Technologies, there has been a real change in the work students and staff have been undertaking. Firstly, having worked in their electives for more than ten weeks, students are now used to working with their chosen materials, in new classes, with a new group of peers. This means a new level of comfort has settled over the workshops and our engineers, carpenters, and metalworkers are able to really show us what they're capable of.

Students at either ends of their Certificate work are making tools using a multitude of engineering skills, our metalworkers are turning steel into art and the wood shops are producing some fantastic and practical furniture and other items. It has been particularly interesting to see student across Technologies look outside their traditional electives and start to include new and innovative skills and processes. Students are using metals to complement their woodwork and timber to enhance their metalwork. Year 12s are using laser engraving to decorate their occasional tables, Year 10s are working with wood as a material for engineering and there are examples across the school of Technologies classes doing out-of-the-box work.

Teaching staff look forward to extending this work with the soon to be commissioned GCODE Lab; including rapid prototyping equipment, large-scale 3D printing, polymer processing and robotic plasma cutting. At Fremantle College the enthusiasm of students, supporting tech, and skilled staff all combine to show the sky really is the limit.

Well done everyone, remember - DREAM BIG!
























VOC Links Student Spotlight by Steve Banzic and Melissa Balfus, VOC Links Teachers
