News from Gifted and Talented by Susan Fahey, Gifted and Talented Coordinator

Sophie Thomas and Isabella Pymm gained selection to the 'Curious Minds' initiative in 2022, a program specifically crafted to empower and nurture the talents of young female STEM enthusiasts. As part of their journey, they were each paired with mentors who guided them through the year-long experience. Their year of learning culminated in an unforgettable camp held in Adelaide recently. Below, Isabella shares her personal reflections on her time at the camp and involvement in the 'Curious Minds' program.

"I enjoyed many aspects of the camp, and I loved the exposure to the different types of STEM (we did 3 hour sessions on 7 different areas of STEM). I loved being surrounded by others who enjoyed STEM like I do. We were put into 'home pods', and we got to spend heaps of time with them, so we had many opportunities to make friends.

There were a lot of hands-on experiments and building in different groups, and all of the staff were enthusiastic about their fields, which made learning about them super fun.

Before the camp, we were asked to make a presentation, with the help of our mentors. about anything to do with STEM, and I chose to do mine on stromatolites, an organism that I learned about while doing lab work with my mentor at a drill core library."

Term 3 is always a busy time with students participating in the Science Talent Search, Maths Talent Quest and Write a Book in a Day activity. Our students have also been busy mentoring the next generation of Gifted and Talented Fremantle College students. Over a period of three Wednesday afternoons during Term 3, we ran our after school extension program - Emerging Scholar. In collaboration with Gifted and Talented students from Year 7 to Year 11, we designed and ran the Emerging Scholars program for Year 5 students who applied to this after-school extension program aimed at potential Gifted and Talented students.

Thank you to Aadhavan, Nathan, Sebastian Rios, Clem Hosking, Zo, Palmer and Sophie for all your help and support running Emerging Scholars. The 2024 cohort of Year 7 Gifted and Talented Fremantle College students were welcomed to the college over a series of transition events. On September 26 our Year 7 2024 students were welcomed for a Day Camp, where a variety of welcoming and challenging activities were conducted to introduce the students to the college and our program. On Friday 8 September our 2024 cohort were invited to test their wits against the three most challenging rooms at Escape Hunt Fremantle. All teams successfully escaped within the hour and enjoyed the opportunity to work as a team and meet new friends.





Our students performed very well across the board and many students achieved distinctions and credits. The schools best performer this year is Elsa Jennings-Hill in the year 8 AE class. Awesome achievement!

Our Academic Extension Academy and GAT students in Years 7, 8 and 9 annually participate in the MAWA Maths Talent Quest (MTQ) investigation. It is a useful opportunity for students to use the mathematical thinking process to formulate their own research based on a situation which interested them and then design, explore, create, think, solve problems, collaborate and communicate their findings.

The submissions were of a very high standard, and six entries were selected to participate in the WA MTQ State competition. One of our Year 9 students, Lucy, achieved a distinction for her individual submission and a group entry from Dylan, Akira, Martin and Oliver amazingly achieved a high distinction.


News from Specialist ICT by Alex Paolino, Specialist ICT Coordinator



Exciting Day of Marine Science!
Our Specialist Marine Studies students had an incredible day at Point Walter recently, joining forces with Scientists from the DBCA's Rivers and Estuaries Science program and Murdoch University for a Marine Workshop.

Some of the highlights from the day's adventure were:

- Seagrass Monitoring: We dived into the fascinating world of seagrasses and their vital role in marine ecosystems.
- Fish Diversity & River Health: Hands-on activities revealed the connection between bottom-dwelling fish populations and water health.
- Extreme Events: We learned how extreme events impact marine life and why continuous water quality monitoring is crucial.
- Microscopic Dinoflagellates: Discovering how dinoflagellates can affect water safety was an eyeopener!
- Inspiring Scientists: Twelve passionate marine scientists shared their journeys and showed us why this field is so rewarding.

This workshop provided students with practical insights into marine science and this opportunity was rewarding for all of our students who made it down to Point Walter today. Stay tuned as there will be more opportunities like this in the future.
