



Contributions and Charges Information Booklet 2024

All students of Fremantle College receive a quality education based on the WA Curriculum. One of the most important ways that parents and carers can support our college to provide the excellent educational opportunities for students is through timely payment of your financial contributions. The following information is provided to make the Contributions and Charges structure clear for parents and caregivers.

## **General Information**

In **Years 7 and 8** students are provided with a set timetable including compulsory subjects with a broad range of courses in The Arts (Music/Visual Art), Technologies (Design and Technology/Home Economics/Digital Technologies) and Languages (Year 7). **Students in Specialist Programs require an individualised timetable**.

In **Years 9 and 10** students complete English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities and Social Science, and Health and Physical Education, and their choice of elective subjects. Students may choose low-cost electives that fit within the voluntary contribution, however, can also choose subjects that attract a compulsory charge. **Students in Specialist Programs require an individualised timetable**.

In Years 11 and 12 students can select from a range of courses, all of which attract a compulsory charge as per Department of Education policy. The charges incurred depend upon the courses chosen. Some specific courses will incur higher costs dependent upon such items as textbooks, subject specific resources, materials, excursions, certificates and work placement. Courses require payment of 50% prior to the end of the 2023 school year with the balance due in Term 1, 2024 (unless a payment plan is arranged). Students involved in work placement must pay the associated fees prior to commencement of the work placement.

#### **Specialist Programs**

The Specialist Programs of Marine Studies, ICT and Contemporary Music, and the AFL Academy are offered at Fremantle College and incur compulsory charges over and above the voluntary contributions. These charges cover resources and activities that are a requirement of the course. If you accept a place in our Specialist or Academy programs, you are also accepting the appropriate charge and must pay 50% prior to the end of the 2023 school year with the balance due in Term 1, 2024 (unless a payment plan is arranged).

#### **Specialist Programs Uniform Requirements:**

Specialist Contemporary Music students require a Fremantle College, black music performance polo shirt, available through Uniform Concepts – anticipated cost of \$30.00.

Specialist Marine Studies students require a Rash shirt which can be ordered through the college – anticipated cost of \$35.00. Staff will arrange fittings and orders.

AFL Academy students require a playing/training jersey, shorts, socks – anticipated cost of \$100.00. Staff can arrange fittings and orders.

## **Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) Program:**

Students attending the ASD program as an alternative to an elective in Years 7 to 10 will be asked to pay a \$20.00 voluntary contribution.



## **Voluntary Contributions and Charges**

**Voluntary Contributions** cover the basic course costs in Years 7 to 10. The payment is \$235.00 and assists the college to provide a higher standard of educational resources for your child including the provision of modern texts and equipment for students. Fremantle College urges you to pay this portion to enable the college to provide your child with the education we believe they deserve.

**Compulsory Charges** cover the cost of Specialist programs that students may be accepted into in Years 7 to 10, and the electives that a student may choose in Years 9 and 10. Courses outside the core educational programs incur charges above the voluntary contribution. All charges are compulsory if you choose for your child to undertake these programs or electives. Course charges for optional courses are required to be paid at the start of the college year. All courses in Years 11 and 12 incur a compulsory charge.

**Subject changes** made during the year may result in adjusted charges. Parents will be notified once the account has been adjusted.

**School Library / Smart Rider Card** Smart Rider cards will be issued to all new students for a \$5.00 charge. The Smart Rider card also doubles as a School Library card. The library card will enable students to borrow books through the library and use the photocopiers. If the card is lost or misplaced, a new card can be issued at the cost of \$5.00 per card. All cards will include a photo for identification purposes.

Years 7 to 10 Education Perfect There will be a \$63.00 charge per student.

Lower school - a portion of the cost of this application for students will be used in Maths, English, Science and HASS.

Years 11 to 12 Education Perfect There will be a \$75.00 charge per student.

Upper school - subject pricing includes all courses within that subject, e.g. Science includes Chemistry, Physics, Biology, Human Biology & Psychology.

**Year 12 Presentation Evening** This event attracts a charge of \$80.00 per student to cover the cost of gown hire, sash and ticket costs for the student. Guests can purchase tickets closer to the event.

## **Library Contribution - \$10.00**

This contribution enables the college to purchase books and research resources for the library.

## **Subscriptions / Publications - \$15.00**

This contribution enables teachers and students to have access to software/apps/on-line resources that are web based relevant educational programs. It also includes publication of enrolment packages, parent information publications and school yearbooks.

## Student Printing - \$10.00

Students are allocated a \$10.00 network printing account. If the student exceeds this allowance they will be required to pay for additional usage. This is the only means in which students will be able to print at the college.

## Information Technology - \$20.00

This request allows Fremantle College to provide internet access and to provide and maintain our fleet of computing devices throughout the college.

#### **Swimming - \$10.00**

Fremantle College has a 50m outdoor swimming pool which is used in Physical Education classes. Swimming skills are considered essential for all in our Australian lifestyle.

#### Student Services - \$30.00

Student Services subsidise events for student well-being including social/reward events, prizes and awards across all year levels.

#### Chaplain - \$5.00

This is to support the presence of a Non-denominational chaplain who is an integral part of the college's Student Services program and is not an employee of the Department of Education.

## P&C Contribution - \$40.00

This is a donation to the P&C as a form of fundraising. They allocate these collections to specific projects around the college for the benefit of students in various ways.

# Financial Assistance: Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS)

## <u>Applications open during Term 1 only – Processed online at Fremantle College Reception</u>

The Government has a Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS) to assist parents with a Health Care card. SAS is available to parents/guardians of secondary students that hold a Centrelink Family Health Care or Pensioner Concession Card or Veteran's Affairs Pensioner (Blue) Concession Card that is current during Term 1.

You will need to <u>bring your card</u> to Reception in Term 1 to apply. The SAS comprises of an Education Program Allowance of \$235 that is put towards Voluntary Contributions (Years 7 to 10) and Charges (Years 11 and 12), and a Clothing Allowance \$115 that can be paid to the college for any Charges or Voluntary Approved Requests or paid to the parent / guardian for uniform expenses.

An application needs to be made each year in order to receive this assistance.

Late applications will only be accepted by the Department of Education in extenuating circumstances and must be accompanied with a written explanation.

Eligible interstate or overseas students who are enrolled after Term 1 may apply for the allowance.

- Centrepay Centrepay is a voluntary bill-paying service which is free for Centrelink customers. Use Centrepay to arrange regular deductions from your Centrelink payment. You can start or change a deduction at any time. The quickest way to do it is through your Centrelink account online. Charges not paid by the end of Term 3 may be referred to a debt collection agency unless arrangements are in place for payments.

## **Collection of Charges and Voluntary Contributions**

The Fremantle College Board encourages early payment each year. In support of the college the Board endorses the following actions:

- Statements of your outstanding amounts will be sent out once a term until cleared.
- Compulsory charges unpaid as at end of Term 3 may be referred to a debt collection agency unless prior arrangements have been made.
- If payment of course charges has not been received, or a payment plan put in place, the college reserves the right to transfer the student into an alternative course that provides an appropriate education pathway for the student.
- Please note that outstanding charges remain on the student's account in subsequent years and can accumulate into a substantial amount.

We encourage families to plan for payment of Compulsory Charges and Voluntary Contributions prior to the end of Term 1, 2024. Fremantle College has several payment options available (see above). ## Course or Subject changes
