



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News from HASS by Payman Hasani, HASS HoLA


On Friday 27 October, Fremantle College took 4 Debating Teams from Year 7 to 10 to compete in the last round of the Interschool Debating Competition for the year.

Compass is a school management solution that allows parents and carers to access up-to-date and meaningful information about your school and your child's progress. Compass includes many different features, including the ability to:

- Monitor your child's attendance, and enter an explanation for absence or lateness
- Communicate with your child's teachers, and update your family contact details
- View your child's timetable and the school calendar
- Book parent-teacher conferences
- Pay and provide consent for events

It is important that all parents have access to Compass as it is regularly used to relay vital information about your child. We recommend using the Compass App for easy access to notifications, attendance notes and upcoming events.
